- \*An Elephant.**





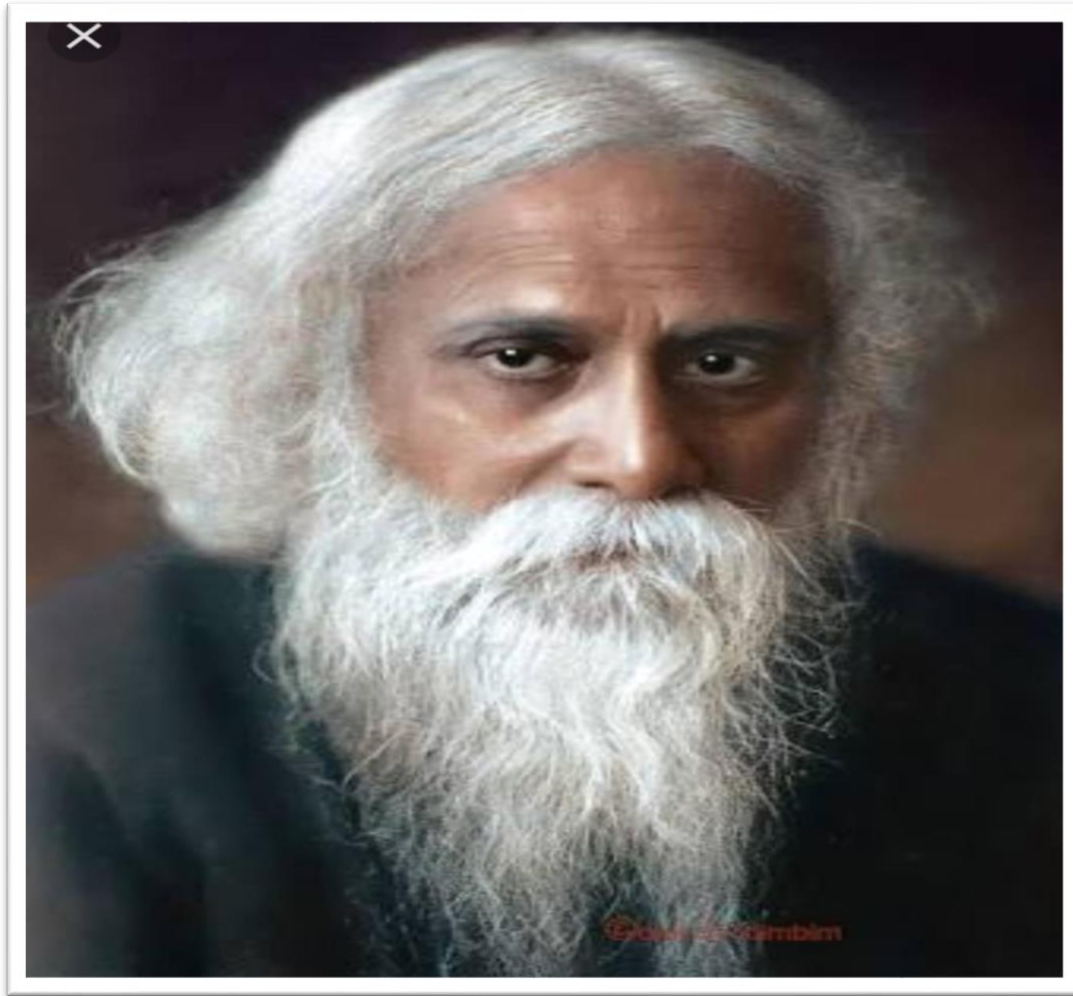
**4. What is written at the bottom of our emblem? What does it mean?**
